### FALL DUMPSTER DAY

#### OCTOBER 1, 2022 FOR GAMBIER VILLAGE & COLLEGE TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS ONLY,

Dumpsters will be placed at the Village Maintenance Building on the South end of Meadow Lane from **8 a.m. to 12:00 noon.** 

No Hazardous Waste items will be collected.

#### Items should be separated as follows:

- 1. Appliances, steel and other metal items
- 2. Trash i.e. items that do not fit the above description

Recycling items will also be collected at Dumpster Day. The drop-off bins are located at the Gambier maintenance Barn at 141 Meadow Lane all year round

#### Please note that brush and small limbs can be brought to Dumpster Day.

Dumpster Day is funded by and open to residents of the Village of Gambier and College Township **ONLY.** Please bring some form of identification showing your address.

### **ELECTRONICS RECYCLING**

Co-hosted by Kenyon College, electronics recycling takes place the first Saturday of every month from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Drop off is located near the dog park in a shipping container. There is a charge of \$20.00 per television any size and \$5.00 per computer monitor or laptops. Drop offs for most other items are free of charge.

Monday October 31, 2022, from 5 pm to 7 pm, Gambier will host our local trick or treat activities. Many of our local "haunts" are hosting events to welcome your little ghouls and goblins, including The Gambier Community Center Library which will extend their hours that day.

Village water pit meters were installed throughout the village to allow monthly readings to be taken without coming onto a resident's property or into their home. The meters, located primarily in the front yard, are susceptible to being hit by a lawnmower or careless driver. Ordinance 1977-4 authorizes the Village to charge for meter repairs or replacement if damaged.

He was promoted to Operator of Record for our Water Department this month. This accomplishment required continuing education and many hours of hard work outside of business hours to achieve. Jeremiah's new duties include daily reporting of usage and water quality, record keeping and submitting reports to the Ohio EPA. He will work closely with the EPA to ensure operational safety and quality of our Village Water Supply.

### WALKING ON SUNSHINE



Workers from Smith Paving of Norwalk install a new sidewalk on Wiggin Street from Meadow Lane to Quarry Chapel. Council approved the sidewalk extension project which came in at just under \$70,000. The project included concrete aprons for residents whose driveway intersected with the new sidewalk. The Village also hired the crew to repair a sidewalk damaged on E. Woodside

### **NEW RRFB**

The Village received a Highway Safety Improvement Grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation this summer. Here, workers from Greenwich Electric install a rectangular rapid flashing beacon at the Ward/Wiggin Street intersection. The push-button device allows motorists to be alerted when there is a pedestrian crossing. Village Council authorized the company to install another RRFB on Meadow Lane across from the Gambier Child Care Center.



### **POCKET PARK**

Council member Kaitlin Sockman has been working with community volunteers to improve the pocket park located between the Post Office and the Village Market. The park was completed just in time for sun dappled fall daydreaming. The convenient location and expanded hours of the Village Market make it a convenient and safe place for picnics after work and class. We hope you get to enjoy the new space.


