

STICK IT TO THE VILLAGE DAY

Stick it to the Village Day, April 24, 2023

The Gambier Maintenance Dept. will pick up bundled piles of sticks. Residents can place them by the road. These piles should only be the sticks and limbs that have fallen from your trees over the winter.

Please **<u>DO NOT</u>** place flower bed cleanings, leaves, pine needles or other debris. Small manageable piles only! Please **do not trim** the trees of large limbs and branches and place them out by the street. Trimmed branches and brush should be brought to the Spring Dumpster Day on **Saturday**, **May 6,2023**.

SPRING DUMPSTER DAY

Spring Dumpster Day, May 6,2023 8A-12P

FOR GAMBIER VILLAGE & COLLEGE TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS ONLY, Dumpsters will be placed at the Village Maintenance Building on the South end of Meadow Lane from 8 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Items should be separated as follows:

- 1. Appliances, steel and other metal items
- 2. Trash i.e. items that do not fit the above description

Recycling items will also be collected at Dumpster Day. The drop-off bins are located at the Gambier maintenance Barn at 141 Meadow Lane year-round.

Please note that brush and small limbs can be brought to Dumpster Day.

Dumpster Day is funded by and open to residents of the Village of Gambier and College Township **ONLY.** Please bring some form of identification showing your address.

No Hazardous Waste items will be collected.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Co-hosted by Kenyon College, electronics recycling takes place the **first Saturday of every month from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.** Drop off is located near the dog park in a shipping container. There is a charge of \$20.00 per television any size and \$5.00 per computer monitor or laptops. Drop offs for most other items are free of charge.



Ohio Outdoor Fire Laws: What You Need to Know

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Regarding Kindled Fires

O.R.C. 1503.18 is under the authority of the Ohio Division of Forestry.

This law prohibits outdoor open burning statewide in unincorporated areas during the months of March, April, May, October, and November between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash, and debris, even in a proper burn barrel.

During spring, wildfire danger is high before plants have turned green, and in fall, fire danger is high due to abundant dry leaves and dead grass. Warm, windy weather in both seasons also contribute to elevated fire risk. Always be sure to use a proper burn barrel when burning outdoors during legal hours.

Ohio Administrative Code 3745.19 Regarding Outdoor Burning



O.A.C. 3745.19 is enforced by the Ohio EPA EPA notification is required for many types of open burns in Ohio.

EPA Basics for Homeowners

Materials NEVER to be burned at any time or any place in Ohio:

- Food Waste
- Dead Animals
- Materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt, or made from petroleum

OTHER RESTRICTIONS:

- Fires must be more than 1,000 feet from neighbor's inhabited building
- No burning when air pollution alert, warning, or emergency is in effect
- Fire/smoke cannot obscure visibility on roadway, railways, or airfields
- · No waste generated off the premises may be burned
- · No burning within village or city limits or restricted areas

COMMUNITY CENTER

Our Community Center has been very busy this year with 52 reservations. The picnic shelters and sports fields held 28 events. Did you know you can reserve

the picnic shelters, ball fields, Village Council Chambers or the Community Center Gym for personal events? This year the Chambers held the knitters' group, AHAH meetings and events, and acupuncture with Dr. Allan Bazzoli. The Gym hosted library events, birthday parties, showers, and even a play. Local individuals or Non-profit organizations are welcome to reserve these spaces for free. The small fees apply if the group is not local or for profit. Rental Rates for after-hours or non-residents are \$25.00 per hour, per room with a minimum of three hours which totals \$75. FROM GAMBIER TO THE GATEWAY

Since 2009, Gateway Regional Arts Center in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky, has partnered with the National Endowment for the Arts to create a distinct contribution to rural arts and culture. On March 10, 2023, the Center hosted the **Kenyon College Chamber Singers** while they were on National Tour. Their concert featured a wide variety from Brahms to Tsonga folk songs.

On March 4, 2023, the GRAC's "Good Golly Miss Dolly!" gallery exhibition, celebrated the "Queen of Appalachia, Dolly Parton." Over 100 individual art pieces were reviewed for show acceptance. Fourteen artists from across the country were selected to exhibit. **Norita Hissong**, Gambier's Utility Clerk, was one of only two artists to have five

separate pieces accepted to the exhibition. Her work included a small sculpture, two wood burnings with pastels, an etch-a-sketch, and a gouache miniature painting. Norita participated in the Gallery's Artist Talk, sharing that her inspiration from Dolly started in childhood. The song "9 to5", which at age five she would sing at the top of her lungs was her first memory of Dolly Parton. The show runs in the Gilley Frye Gallery through April 4, 2023.



NEW GENERATOR

Wallace Chapin of Howard completed the final installation of a natural gas-powered generator for the village maintenance barn. Gambier employees often get called out after hours because of incidents related to a power outage and their ability to effectively respond to the emergency has been limited without the back-up power supply. Buckingham Electric was the general contractor and Mickley Plumbing assisted on the \$30,000 capital improvement project Council approved last year.
