Gambier Citizen of the Year 2023

This year's Citizen of the Year has been described as "an extraordinary force for good in the community." During her decades in the village, she has worked tirelessly to advocate for students at Kenyon and in the broader Knox County community. When she sees a need in the community, she just does the work, and invites others to join her. In doing so, she makes us all better citizens. For more than 15 years, she has organized a

school supply drive raising thousands of dollars, collecting backpacks, calculators, crayons, pencils, clothes, period supplies, and notebooks, for students at Wiggin Street Elementary, Mount Vernon Middle School, Knox County Career Center, and Knox County Head Start. Her porch has become a drop-off zone for both the Mount Vernon Free Pantry and the Source at Kenyon, and just about every other community fundraiser. On an individual level, she is always feeding people and creating a chosen family within the community. Many Kenyon students have enjoyed home cooked meals at her home, and alumni who graduated decades ago still consider her family. During COVID lockdown she cooked dinner twice a week for neighbors with a newborn and no childcare. And she befriends neighborhood children so that they'll always know there's a safe adult nearby. NATURE PLAY AREA



Village Council authorized an improvement to the Community Park by adding a nature play area which includes new hills, tunnels, and slides. McDaniels Construction of Columbus performed the improvement under the architectural design of Implement LLC. Knox Community Foundation provided much of the funding for the design element while the village used park improvement funds to pay for the construction. Kenyon provided the topsoil from previous construction projects which helped reduce the cost of the project.

SIDEWALK PROJECT

Workers from Smith Paving in Norwalk, OH constructed a sidewalk on parts of Brooklyn, Ward and Kokosing this summer to help fill in the gaps where pedestrians still had to use the public street to walk through the village and campus. This new sidewalk will make it much safer for these pedestrians.

CONGRATULATIONS

Join us in congratulating Jeremiah Denuit once again this fall. Jeremiah began working in the Village Maintenance Department in 2006. He was promoted to Operator of Record for our Water Department last year. Jeremiah has broadened his horizons by earning a Wastewater Operator 1 license. He is now dually licensed in water and wastewater. This accomplishment will be very valuable to our community. We join only a handful of Ohio communities that have in-house operators ensuring the safety of both our water and wastewater system. Thanks to this commitment we will experience faster response times to issues, reduced dependance on outside companies for testing and maintenance, and more efficient communication with the Ohio EPA.

FALL DUMPSTER DAY and ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

OCTOBER 7, 2023, 8AM to 12PM

No Hazardous Waste items will be collected.

Dumpster Day: is funded by and open to residents of the Village of Gambier and College Township **ONLY.** Please bring some form of identification showing your address.

Dumpsters will be located at the Gambier maintenance Barn at 141 Meadow Lane.

Please note that recycling items, brush, and small limbs can be brought to Dumpster Day.

Items should be separated as follows:

- 1. Appliances, steel, and other metal items
- 2. Trash, i.e., items that do not fit the above description.

Electronics Recycling: Co-hosted by Kenyon College, electronics recycling takes place the first Saturday of every month from **11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m**. Drop off is located near the dog park in a shipping container. There is a charge of \$20.00 per television of any size and \$5.00 per computer monitor or laptops. Drop offs for most other items are free of charge. with interest in participation.

DIGITAL MAPPING PROJECT BEGINS

The Village received a \$50,000 grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to inventory and digitally map every water service line for each property in the village. Applying for the grant was a pro-active move for early compliance with the US EPA's Lead and Copper Rule Revision that takes effect Oct. 16, 2024. To map and catalog every service line and its composition will require us to visit every home to verify this information. We have hired two Interns to help with the project, we would like to introduce them to you.
